Ancestors of Mary Elizabeth Duffey

Generation 1

 Mary Elizabeth Duffey (daughter of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 23 May 1878 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan, United States. She died on 23 Oct 1916 in Jackson, Jackson, Michigan, USA. She married Anton Lienhart (son of Thomas Lienhart and Mary Anne Noltner) on 09 Jan 1902 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, MI. He was born on 04 Feb 1871 in Balzhofen, Rastatt, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He died on 15 Jun 1959 in Pinellas, Florida, USA.

Notes for Mary Elizabeth Duffey:

Mary Elizabeth Duffey (Lizzie) was born May 23, 1878 in Bunker Hill Michigan, the 5th child in her family. At the time she was born her father was a farm laborer living somewhere in the vicinity of Catholic Church Road and Williamston Road. At some point in the 1880s I think he moved the family onto his father's farm, where they remained. In 1990 a house was built there, at 4619 Parman Road, and it still stands there.

Lizzie Duffey probably lived at home until she finished school, and apparently went to work as a domestic servant in a home in Jackson, Michigan. The 1900 Census for Jackson and the 1902 Jackson City Directory show a Lizzie Duffee, b May 1878, as a servant in the home of Morris O'Connell, at 212 Grove Ave. O'Connell was an engineer at Michigan Central Railroad. This stretch of Grove Ave. appears to now be the 1500 or 1600 block of Homewild Ave.

On 9 Jan 1902 Mary Elizabeth Duffey married Anthony Lienhart, probably at the Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church where they both attended. Anthony was a German immigrant farm laborer, with ambitions to have his own farm. It must have raised some eyebrows when this attractive young Irish-American woman, in the midst of Irish-American farm country, decided to take a German husband.

They apparently lived for about 10 years in Bunker Hill a few miles east of the Church, before moving to the corner of Catholic Church Road and Haynes Road. The house there eventually became the center of a farm of around 450 acres, as big as three or four average farms. That house is still in use, but the other farm buildings that were there have mostly disappeared.

Elizabeth had 10 children from 1903 to 1915. Her six sons all helped on the farm until they were old enough to escape. Only Clare, born in 1913, was interested in staying on and making a living at farming. Anthony also hired farm laborers, some of whom lived there. My dad, James Lienhart, Anthony's oldest grandson, worked on the farm sometimes when he was in high school in the early 1940s.

Elizabeth died in the hospital in Jackson in October 1916 of a ruptured appendix, at age 38. She left 10 children behind, with the oldest, Joe, just 13 years old.

He died on 19 Jan 1912 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan, United States (Bunker Hill Cemetery, Bunker Hill, Ingham County, MI). He married **Mary Ann Quinn** (daughter of John Quinn and Margaret F. Fleming) on 04 Oct 1870 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan, USA.
- 3. **Mary Ann Quinn** (daughter of John Quinn and Margaret F. Fleming) was born on 27 Apr 1849 in Rochester, Monroe, New York, USA. She died on 13 Feb 1905 in Stockbridge, Ingham County, Michigan, USA (Apoplexy).

Notes for Thomas Cornelius Duffey:

Thomas Cornelius(?) Duffey, or Thomas Duffey Jr., was born 1 Sep 1845 in Ypsilanti, Washtenaw County, MI. He was the 2nd of 10 children. By 1850 his father moved the family to a

farm in Lyndon Township, Washtenaw County, which is where Thomas Jr. spent his boyhood. In about 1868 his father moved the family to a farm on the west edge of Stockbridge Township, Ingham County, about 10 miles northwest of his previous farm. Thomas, in his early 20s, was still in his father's household, working on the family farm, at least until he married in October 1870.

His bride was Mary Ann Quinn, the oldest child of John Quinn and Margaret Fleming Quinn, who had moved to Bunker Hill Township, probably from Ypsilanti, in the late 1860s. Quinn appears to have had a small farm less than three miles west of the Duffey farm, and the two Irish Catholic families may have become acquainted at their church.

In the 1880 census, Thomas and Mary Ann and children are in Bunker Hill, and his occupation was "farm laborer". His household is adjacent to that of Christopher Cavender, who had 240 acres 1/2 mile west of Saints Cornelius and Cyprian church (on Catholic Church road on the west side of Williamston Road). Christopher Cavender was a brother of Thomas Jr.'s mother. His younger brother Mathew was a farm laborer living in Cavender's household. The census does not say if Thomas Jr. was also working on that farm.

In 1889 Thomas's father died. At that time or before it appears that Thomas Jr. took over the farm of Thomas Sr., in Section 30 on the west edge of Stockbridge Township, about 1 mile northeast of Fitchburg. I believe that Thomas Jr. built a new house for his family there in 1890, at 4619 Parman Road (near Heeney Road) which still stands. This was located less than a mile west of the farm of another of Thomas's uncles, James Cavender.

In the 1900 census, Thomas and Mary Ann still had six children living at home, including three boys in their 20s. Two of them were working on the family farm, and one was a painter (probably of houses and barns). Of their 12 children, only nine survived to 1900. The three older daughters, as yet unmarried, had all left the household to work elsewhere.

In 1905 Mary Ann died, of apoplexy. In the 1910 census, the head of household was shown as 24-year-old Joseph Duffey, one of Thomas's sons. Joseph's wife Mary also appeared there, 64-year-old Thomas was still there, as were his adult sons Edward (a carpenter) and Leo (not employed). Also Mary's 11-year-old sister.

Thomas Duffey Jr. died on 19 Jan 1912, and was buried at the Catholic Cemetery in Bunker Hill.

Notes for Mary Ann Quinn:

Mary Ann Quinn was the first child of John and Margaret Fleming Quinn, born 27 April 1849 in Rochester, Monroe County, New York. Within about a year of her birth, the family seems to have moved to the township of Wheatland, southwest of Rochester, and lived in the hamlet of Garbuttsville (now Garbutt). In the late 1850s the growing family moved to Ypsilanti, Washtenaw County, Michigan, and in the late 1860s they moved to Bunker Hill, Ingham County, Michigan. In 1870 the last of 14 children were born, although I don't believe all survived childhood.

It was probably in Bunker Hill, near Fitchburg, that Mary Ann Quinn met Thomas Duffey Jr., who lived a few miles away and also attended the only Catholic Church in the area. The two married in October 1870. The couple went on to have 13 children, with 4 dying as infants or as small children, as far as I can tell. The remainder of what little I know about Mary Ann is told in the profile of her husband.

Mary Ann Quinn Duffey died 31 May 1913 of 'Apoplexy' and was buried at Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Cemetery.

Mary Ann Quinn and Thomas Cornelius Duffey had the following children:

i. John Thomas Duffey (son of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 01 Aug 1871 in Fitchburg, MI. He died on 21 May 1956 in Bunker Hill, MI. He married Margaret May Updike (daughter of Sidney A. Updike and Ellen Ryan) on 24 Jul 1924 in Highland Park, Wayne, Michigan, USA. She was born on 02 Jun 1882 in Leoni, Jackson, Michigan, USA. She died on 19 Apr 1971 in Stockbridge, Ingham, MI (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI).

Notes for Margaret May Updike:

Margaret 'Mae' Updike's father was Sidney Updike (1850-1929) and her mother was Ellen Ryan Updike (1847-1901). Her known siblings were Ansen, Lena, Frost, and Lola. The family lived near Grass Lake, Jackson County, MI when Mae was growing up.

Mae Updike was 42 when she married John Duffey, and she and her husband had no children. According to one obit, she and her husband were paperhangers in Fitchburg. They wintered in St. Petersburg, Florida before her husband died in 1956. I believe she continued to live in Fitchburg after his death in 1956, until moving to Ranck Green Meadow Home in Stockbridge about 1967. Her obit said she lived several years in New York and Colorado before her marriage.

'Aunt Mae' is the only Duffey that I remember. I recall in the '60s going with my mother, Phyllis Lienhart, to pick her up at home and take her shopping or other places sometimes. She was wheelchair-bound, so she couldn't drive or go anywhere without assistance. I remember her as being always remarkably cheerful and upbeat. - Ted Lienhart

- James H Duffey (son of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 25 Jan 1873 in Stockridge, MI. He died on 23 Nov 1957 in Grayling, Crawford, Michigan, USA.
- iii. Margaret Ellen Duffey (daughter of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 01 Oct 1875 in Saginaw, MI. She died on 27 Oct 1954 in Jackson, Michigan, United States. She married Louis Bernard Devine (son of Patrick Devine and Margaret Maloney) on 15 Jun 1909 in Leslie, Ingham, Michigan, USA (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI). He was born on 29 Oct 1878 in Jackson, Mi. He died on 22 Sep 1941 in Jackson, Jackson, Michigan (St. John's Cemetery, Jackson, Michigan).
- iv. William Mathew Duffey (son of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 01 Apr 1876 in Stockridge, MI. He died in Casper, WY, USA. He married Agnes. She was born in 1867 in Indiana.
- v. Mary Elizabeth Duffey (daughter of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 23 May 1878 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan, United States. She died on 23 Oct 1916 in Jackson, Jackson, Michigan, USA. She married Anton Lienhart (son of Thomas Lienhart and Mary Anne Noltner) on 09 Jan 1902 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, MI. He was born on 04 Feb 1871 in Balzhofen, Rastatt, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He died on 15 Jun 1959 in Pinellas, Florida, USA.
 - vi. Edward Lawrence Duffey (son of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 22 Feb 1880 in Stockbridge, Ingham, Michigan. He died on 18 Jul 1965 in Jackson, Jackson, Michigan (St. John's Cemetery, Jackson, Michigan). He married Peg Culhane on 19 Nov 1912.
 - vii. Catherine Ethel Duffey (daughter of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 08 Sep 1881 in Stockridge, Ingham, MI. She died on 13 Jul 1902 in Stockbridge, Ingham, MI.
 - viii. Anna T Duffey (daughter of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 10 Feb 1883 in Stockridge, MI. She died in Sep 1883 in Stockridge, MI.
 - ix. Ann L Duffey (daughter of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 07 May 1884 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, MI. She died on 09 Dec 1884 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, MI (Disease of Brain).
 - x. Joseph Frank Duffey (son of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 14 Oct 1885 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, MI. He died on 27 Oct 1959 in Jackson, Michigan, United States (St. John's Cemetery, Jackson, Michigan). He married Mary E. Culhane on 08 Sep 1909 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Cemetery, Leslie, Ingham, Michigan, USA). She was born on 25 May 1887. She died on 06 Jan 1964 in Jackson, MI.

- xi. Leo Peter Duffey (son of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 28 Oct 1888 in Delta, Eaton, Ml. He died in 1973 in Brownsville, Texas, USA. He married Mary Agnes Schrant (daughter of Herman Schrant and Elizabeth Bockhorst) in 1917. She was born in 1886. She died on 23 Oct 1918 in Hamler, Henry, Ohio, USA (Saint Paul's Cemetery, Hamler, Henry, Ohio). He married Mary Mathilda Wick on 30 Sep 1919 in St. Paul Church, Highland, Madison, IL. She was born on 12 Jul 1896 in Highland, Madison, Illinois, USA. She died on 13 Jun 1966 in Saint Louis, Missouri (Saint Joseph Cemetery, Highland, Madison, Illinois).
- xii. Agnes L. Duffey (daughter of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 21 May 1889 in Stockbridge, MI. She died in 1892.
 - Notes for Agnes L. Duffey: Phyllis Bungart's records say that Agnes died of diptheria.
- xiii. Richard E Duffey (son of Thomas Cornelius Duffey and Mary Ann Quinn) was born on 31 Jan 1892 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, MI. He died on 03 Sep 1892 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, MI (Cholera Infantrum).

Generation 3

- 4. **Thomas Duffey** was born in 1816 in Ireland. He died on 11 Jan 1889 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI). He married **Elizabeth Cavender** (daughter of James Cavender and Elizabeth Flood) on 09 Jan 1843.
- 5. **Elizabeth Cavender** (daughter of James Cavender and Elizabeth Flood) was born in 1823 in New York. She died on 09 Jul 1900 in Bunkerhill, Ingham County, Michigan, USA.

Notes for Thomas Duffey:

The story of Thomas Duffy has been pieced together entirely from vital sources such as censuses, plat maps, and death records, leaving some discrepancies and gaps in his profile. Notes from another amateur genealogist provided some useful info as well as some info that I have not been able to corroborate.

Thomas Duffy was born in Ireland between 1816 and 1819. I don't know when he came to the U.S., or whether he came as an adult or with his parents. By the beginning of the 1840s he was apparently in Sylvan or Lyndon Township, in the northwestern corner of Washtenaw County, MI, because he met and married Elizabeth Cavender, who was living with her parents on the west side of Cavanaugh Lake, four miles west of Chelsea. No doubt he attended Mount Calvary Catholic Church, then located about 1 1/2 miles NE from Cavanaugh Lake (just off Bush Road). The church no longer exists, but the cemetery is still there. Elizabeth Cavender's parents are buried there.

I believe Thomas Duffy and Elizabeth Cavender were married 9 January 1843, and lived in Ypsilanti for several years, where they began a family. By 1850 they were living in Lyndon Township (northwest of Chelsea), as their family was in the Federal Census that year. He is listed as a farmer, with \$500 worth of real estate. In 1854 Thomas bought more land, from the Federal Government, in Lyndon Township. It is described as the NW Quarter of the SE Quarter of Section 15 (40 acres). This is 1/2 mile SE of South Lake. There is no longer any road near the property, although it is in the vicinity of N. Territorial and Embury Road. The area is now crossed by the Waterloo-Pinckney Hiking Trail. So at some point in the 1840s Thomas became a farmer.

There were two other Duffey households in Lyndon in 1850, apparently adjacent to each other and not far from the home of Thomas and Elizabeth. One house was headed by Owen and Bridget Duffey, both 50, with two children. They are barely old enough to have been the parents of Thomas. The other house was headed by John, 45, with Hugh, 45, and Mary, 54. It isn't clear if Mary was the spouse of either John or Hugh. John and Hugh were likely twins if their ages are correct, and probably not old enough to be father of Thomas. It seems likely that there is a family relationship between all of these Duffies and Thomas because of their proximity, but I cannot determine what it is.

Trying to figure out the relationship through research websites is complicated by the fact that there are other Duffies in nearby townships, who don't seem to be closely related to Thomas, but

many of them have the same first names. Most families have a John, James, and Mary, for example. Thomas, Margaret, Elizabeth, and Patrick were also very common first names.

In the 1860 Census for Lyndon, in the Agricultural schedule, Thomas Duffey is shown with 50 acres of improved (tilled) land, and 110 acres of unimproved land, valued at \$1,600.

According to info from one genealogist, Thomas Duffey bought 197 acres in 1868 in Stockbridge township, Ingham County, MI. He says it was in the SE Quarter and NE part of the SW Quarter, but does not say which section. An 1874 plat map shows T. Duffee with 16 acres in the NW corner of Section 30 (adjacent to Bunker Hill township), and a 69 acre plot directly north of it in Section 19 registered to J. Duffee. In an 1895 map, both those plots show up in the name of T Duffey, and the southern one grew to 35 acres, for a total of 104 acres. It is located about three miles west of Stockbridge, and about 8 miles west of their previous property in Lyndon Township.

In 1868 or soon thereafter, Thomas and Elizabeth moved their family to Stockbridge. The 1870 Federal Census shows Thomas, 52, a farmer, with land valued at \$2,800 and other property worth \$1,075. His wife Elizabeth, 45, is followed by young Thomas, 23, and 7 more children. Later in 1870, Thomas Jr. married Mary Ann Quinn and probably moved out of the house.

In the 1880 Census Thomas's age is shown as 64 and Elizabeth's as 58. This is the first time a census form asked if a person was blind, and that box is checked for Thomas. Another source said Thomas was blind at age 40, but provides no evidence. Their two oldest sons, John and Peter, were both employed on the family farm, and 19-year-old Mary is at home with housework.

In 1889 Thomas Duffy died. We have a brief mention in the newspaper, that he was an "old and respected resident of Stockbridge". He was buried at Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Cemetery, in Bunker Hill, Ingham County.

Notes for Elizabeth Cavender:

Elizabeth Cavender (aka Cavanaugh) was born somewhere in New York, around 1818 to 1823, to James Cavender and his wife Elizabeth Flood Cavender. Both parents were natives of Ireland. Elizabeth was the oldest, or second oldest, child in the family. Probably about 1837 James Cavender had moved with his family to land he bought that year from the U.S. government in Sylvan Township, Washtenaw County, next to a lake soon known as Cavanaugh Lake. That is four miles west of Chelsea, MI.

In the early 1840s Thomas Duffey moved into the area and, being also Irish Catholic, probably met the Cavendar family at the nearby Mount Cavalry Catholic Church. In January 1843 Thomas Duffey married Elizabeth Cavendar. From that date onward the information I have on Elizabeth is the same I have for Thomas Duffey, and you will find it under his entry. Elizabeth Cavender Duffy died in Bunker Hill township, Ingham County on July 9, 1900, and was

- v. Margaret Duffey (daughter of Thomas Duffey and Elizabeth Cavender) was born on 29 Jan 1852 in Sylvan, Washtenaw, Michigan. She died on 10 Nov 1873 in Stockbridge, Ingham, MI (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI).
- vi. Elizabeth Duffey (daughter of Thomas Duffey and Elizabeth Cavender) was born in May 1854 in Michigan. She died on 29 Apr 1902 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan. She married Chauncey J. Shufelt on 16 Sep 1877 in Henrietta, Jackson, Michigan. He was born in 1850 in Middleburgh, Schoharie, New York, USA. He died on 13 Jan 1913 in Kalamazoo, Kalamazoo, Michigan, United States.

Notes for Chauncey J. Shufelt:

The Hynes and Garber Family Tree says that Shufelt was a patient at Kalamazoo Psychiatric hospital in 1900 and died there in 1913.

He died on 15 Mar 1913 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan, USA (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Parish Cemetery, Leslie, MI). He married Bridget McCloskey in 1888. She was born on 06 Nov 1865 in New York. She died on 27 Mar 1942 in Jackson, Jackson, Michigan (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI).

Notes for Mathew Duffey:

He married Margaret Carroll (daughter of Nicholas Carroll and Mary Daily) on 12 Apr 1893 in Lansing, Ingham, Michigan, USA. She was born on 16 Mar 1871 in Lansing, Ingham, Michigan, USA. She died on 08 Feb 1933 in Lansing, Ingham, Michigan, USA.

Notes for Mary Duffey:

Died of consumption. Her death record says she was single.

x. Peter Duffey (son of Thomas Duffey and Elizabeth Cavender) was born on 12 Nov 1863 in Stockbridge, Ingham, Michigan. He died on 25 Jan 1905 in Stockbridge, Ingham County, Michigan, USA (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI).

Notes for Peter Duffey:

His death certificate said he was single.

- 6. **John Quinn** (son of Patrick Quinn and Mary Haberlin) was born on 10 Nov 1814 in Fahee, Kilkenny, Ireland. He died on 31 May 1913 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan, United States (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI). He married **Margaret F. Fleming** (daughter of Richard Fleming and Bridget Loftus) in 1847 in Rochester, New York (St. Patrick's Cathedral).
- 7. **Margaret F. Fleming** (daughter of Richard Fleming and Bridget Loftus) was born in 1827 in Ireland. She died on 21 Aug 1891 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan, United States (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Catholic Church, Leslie, Ingham, MI).

Notes for John Quinn:

John Quinn was born about 1813 in County Kilkenny, Ireland. I have his hometown as either

Fahee or Waterford. In 1840 he emigrated to the U.S. and appears to have been living in New York state in the 1840s. In 1847 John married Margaret Fleming in Rochester, NY, and the couple moved from Rochester to Wheatland, Monroe County, New York in 1849 or 1850. In Wheatland, they seem to have lived in the hamlet of Garbuttsville.

In the late 1850s the family, now with five or six children, moved to Ypsilanti, in Washtenaw County, Michigan. In 1868 or 1869 the family again moved, to Bunker Hill, Ingham County, MI. The last child, the 14th, was born in 1870 in Bunker Hill.

John Quinn's occupation is variously shown as a cooper, tailor, and farmer. Although I don't have a birthdate for him, when he died in 1913 he was said to be 100 years old.

Notes for Margaret F. Fleming:

Margaret was born in Ireland in 1827 and probably came to New York with her parents. I have no other details about her except those notes that appear in her husband's (John Quinn's) entry.

 - ix. Richard Quinn (son of John Quinn and Margaret F. Fleming) was born in 1862 in Ypsilanti, Michigan. He died on 13 Jan 1937 in Bunkerhill, Ingham, MI, USA.

Notes for Richard Quinn:

- In the 1900 census, Richard is living with his father, uncle, and sister Catherine in Bunker Hill. His occupation is farm laborer.

Notes for Edward Quinn:

The source of this obituary is unknown, but is probably either the Ingham County News or Ingham County Democrat:

"July 23, 1931, Bunkerhill

Funeral services for Ed. V. Quinn of North Leslie, were held in SS. Cornelius and Cyprian's church on Tuesday, July 21, at 9:00 a.m. when a requiem high mass was chanted by Rev. John M. Duffy, pastor. Mr. Quinn who died at the age of 67 years at the home of his brother, Richard Quinn, in Bunker Hill, on Sunday July 19th after an illness of four weeks, was the son of John Quinn and Margaret Fleming, being one of fourteen children. He was born in Ypsilanti, Michigan, February 14, 1864; and when four years old his parents moved to Bunker Hill and there he spent the rest of his life, with the exception of the last ten years when he resided in North Leslie. In 1891 he was united in marriage to Katherine Heeney of Bunker Hill, who died in 1894. He is survived by one son, James Quinn of Bunker Hill, and seven grandchildren; also two brothers Richard and William of Bunker Hill and three sisters: Miss Kate Quinn of Bunker Hill, Mrs. J. M. Wall of Toledo, Ohio and Mrs. Felix Cavender of Stockbridge. A large number of relatives and friends attended the funeral. The burial was held in the Bunker Hill Catholic cemetery."

- xii. Nellie Quinn (daughter of John Quinn and Margaret F. Fleming) was born in 1866 in Ypsilanti, Michigan. She died in 1923 in Toledo, Ohio. She married John Moan.

She died on 04 Oct 1934 in Stockbridge, Ingham, Michigan, USA (Saints Cornelius and Cyprian Parish Cemetery, Leslie, MI). She married Felix Philip Cavender (son of James E. Cavender and Ellen Cassidy) on 11 Nov 1893 in Ingham, Michigan. He was born on 17 Oct 1868 in Bunker Hill, Ingham, Michigan. He died on 12 Mar 1959 (Buried Leslie, Ingham, Michigan).

Notes for James Cavender:

James Cavender was born about 1778 in Kildare County, Ireland. According to one source, he was from Athy, Old Court. I did not find Athy on a map, but there is today a small place, the size of a farm, named Oldcourt in County Kildare. According to their gravestone, his wife, Elizabeth Flood was from County Kildare also, which suggests they may have been married before they emigrated to the U.S. However, another source says she was from County Meath, which borders County Kildare on the north.

The couple lived in New York state for many years, at least from 1818 to 1833, when all their children were born. According to records of land purchases from the Federal Government, James Cavender of Westchester County NY bought 80 acres of land on 1 April 1837. This land

is on the SW shore of Cavanaugh Lake, about 2 miles west of Chelsea, in Sylvan township, Washtenaw Co. On 1 Sep 1848 James Cavender bought an additional 40 acres adjacent (SE Q of SE Q of Section 8), which was along the SE shore of Cavanaugh Lake.

Sometime after their daughter Elizabeth and her husband Thomas Duffey moved to Stockbridge Township to farm, Elizabeth's brother James established a farm just one mile east of that of Thomas and Elizabeth.

So it appears that James and Elizabeth were in New York until about 1837, when they moved to Sylvan Township. They lived in Sylvan the remainder of their lives, and were both buried in the nearby Mount Calvary cemetery.

Notes for Elizabeth Flood:

Please see the notes for Elizabeth's husband, James Cavender. They contain the only information that I have for Elizabeth Flood.

Notes for Patrick Markey:

A profile of his son, James, says Patrick Markey was one of the earliest settlers in Bunker Hill, moving from his original homestead to another farm 3 miles away in 1865, and to Blackman Township, Jackson County in 1871.
